Old Testament Lesson

In the ancient Medo-Persian Empire, Daniel was threatened with death for his faith. It wasn't because of any public or inflammatory speech. It was because he prayed in his home. 500 years later, Jesus' disciples were threatened with death if they continued to preach in Jesus' name. 1500 years after that, Martin Luther was threatened with death if he continued to preach the Gospel.

In every case God's faithful people declared that they would rather face persecution than deny their Savior. They would do his work and follow his commands no matter what the cost.

What threats do you face for your faith? There is always a price to pay for faithfulness. We might not face lions or wind up in court, but we can lose relationships because of moral purity. We can lose promotions because of worship priorities. We can lose friendships because we won't condone sin.

Faithfulness to God's Word in the face of persecution requires trust. God shut the lions' mouths to answer the king's question: Is your God able to rescue you? Yes, he is. God shut the lions' mouths to show his Church of all the ages that God is able to guard and keep his own. You can trust him and be faithful to his Word in the face of any persecution.

Daniel 6:10-12,16-23 (EHV)

¹⁰Now, when Daniel learned that the document had been signed, he went to his house. It had windows on its upper story that opened toward Jerusalem. Three times each day he would get on his knees and pray and offer praise before his God. He continued to do that, just as he had been

doing before this. ¹¹Then these men came as a group and found Daniel praying and seeking favor from his God.

¹²They then went and asked the king about the decree. “Your Majesty, did you not sign a decree that anyone who prays to any god or person for thirty days except to you, Your Majesty, would be thrown into the den of lions?”

The king answered, “Indeed I did. The order is established as a law of the Medes and the Persians that cannot be revoked.”

¹⁶Then the king gave the order, and Daniel was brought and thrown into the lions’ den. The king said to Daniel, “May your God, whom you serve continually, rescue you.” ¹⁷A stone was brought and placed over the mouth of the pit. The king sealed it with his signet ring and the signet rings of his nobles so that nothing could be changed with regard to Daniel’s situation. ¹⁸Then the king went to his palace. He spent the night without food, and no entertainment was brought before him. But he could not sleep.

¹⁹At dawn the king arose as soon as it was light and hurried to the lions’ den. ²⁰As he came near the pit, he cried out in a fearful voice. The king said to Daniel, “Daniel, servant of the living God, was your God, whom you serve continually, able to rescue you from the lions?”

²¹Then Daniel spoke with the king. “Your Majesty, may you live forever! ²²My God sent his angel and shut the mouth of the lions. They have not hurt me because he found me innocent in his presence. Also before you, Your Majesty, I have committed no crime.”

²³Then the king was very glad and said that Daniel should be brought up from the pit. So Daniel was brought up from the pit, and he was unharmed because he trusted in his God.

Gospel Lesson

Speaking the Word of God has always carried a price. Jesus warned us about that. He told us that he was sending us out as sheep among wolves. He also told us that he would use that persecution to give his servants the chance to share the Gospel. He promised that the Holy Spirit would speak through us when we stand trial. He kept that promise when Stephen, the first martyr, stood trial.

When persecution broke out after Stephen’s death, Christians were jailed, tortured and killed because they refused to deny their Savior. Every one of the apostles went to jail. All but one was killed for his faith. Years later, Martin Luther was threatened, declared an outlaw, hunted and vilified for teaching what the Bible said. Everything that Jesus told us has happened.

These days, the persecution has changed. Instead of vehement, murderous threats, Christians are now insulted, branded, belittled, and

ignored. It's not coincidence that liquor stores, marijuana dispensaries, and bars are called "essential," while churches are labeled "non-essential." It's part of the new persecution. Condemning sin is now unacceptable and promoting righteousness is branded "judgmental." We're called unloving, closed minded, and evil.

And it hurts. Being rejected and maligned is heart breaking. It can make us want to keep our faith to ourselves. We have to stand with each other and encourage each other to stand with Christ when it's dangerous, unpopular, painful, or just plain hard. Jesus promised, "All men will hate you because of me, but he who stands firm to the end will be saved."

Jesus doesn't guarantee an absence of persecution, but faithfulness in spite of it. Jesus told us that we will witness to the Word of God before brothers, fathers, children, governors and princes. What comfort that brings. With Martin Luther we declare: "Here I stand. I can do no other. God help me. Amen."

Matthew 10:16-23 (EHV)

¹⁶“Look, I am sending you out as sheep among wolves. So be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves. ¹⁷Be on guard against people. They will hand you over to councils, and they will whip you in their synagogues. ¹⁸You will be brought into the presence of governors and kings for my sake, as a testimony to them and to the Gentiles. ¹⁹Whenever they hand you over, do not be worried about how you will respond or what you will say, because what you say will be given to you in that hour. ²⁰In fact you will not be the ones speaking, but the Spirit of your Father will be speaking through you.

²¹“Brother will hand over his brother to death, and a father will do the same with his child. Children will rise up against parents and have them put to death. ²²You will be hated by all people because of my name, but whoever endures to the end will be saved. ²³And when they persecute you in one town, flee to the next. Amen I tell you: You will not finish going through the cities of Israel before the Son of Man comes.

Epistle Lesson/Sermon Text:

Paul knew firsthand that faithfulness to the Word of God brought persecution. His friends had abandoned him and his enemies never stopped hounding him. He was in jail when he wrote this second letter to Timothy and he expected to die there.

Paul had been forsaken by his friends, but he was not alone. Paul knew that he was never alone, even when his friends deserted him. Jesus was always with him. Paul trusted in God's answer to Darius' question in the Old Testament: "Was your God able to rescue you?" Jesus fulfilled the first promise in the Gospel lesson: "the Spirit of your Father will be speaking through you." And Paul believed the second promise, too: "whoever endures to the end will be saved."

Paul knew that God would rescue him from every evil—not always avoiding danger, but being with him through danger. Paul knew that even if he died for Christ, God would rescue him and bring him to heaven. Eventually the headsman's sword took Paul's life; and Jesus rescued him and took him to his heavenly kingdom.

Lord, keep us faithful in the face of any persecution!.

2 Timothy 4:9-18 (EHV)

⁹ Make every effort to come to me quickly, ¹⁰ for Demas, because he loved this present world, has forsaken me and gone to Thessalonica.

Crescens has gone to Galatia, and Titus to Dalmatia. ¹¹ Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and bring him with you, because he is useful to me for ministry. ¹² I have sent Tychicus to Ephesus. ¹³ When you come, bring the cloak I left in Troas with Carpus, and the scrolls, especially the parchments.

¹⁴ Alexander the coppersmith did me a great deal of harm. The Lord will pay him back for what he did. ¹⁵ You be on your guard against him also, because he vehemently opposed our message.

¹⁶ At my first hearing, no one came to my defense, but everyone deserted me. May it not be counted against them. ¹⁷ But the Lord stood by me and strengthened me, so that through me the message would be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles would hear it, and I was rescued from the lion's mouth. ¹⁸ The Lord will rescue me from every evil work and will bring me safely into his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.
