Old Testament Lesson

The Glory of the King

Jesus is the King of the Universe, the Almighty Judge of all that exists. He can go anywhere. He can do anything. And nobody can tell him, "No!"

So, with unlimited options and ultimate authority, what does the omnipotent God of all creation choose to do?

He shepherds lost and wandering sheep.

Is there any greater expression of grace? Has there every been a more profound act of love? From his high and lofty throne, Jesus saw that we were lost. He came down to find us. He saw that we were hurt. He came to heal us. He saw that we were weak. He came to give us strength.

And now, Jesus Christ, king of Kings and lord of Lords, undisputed ruler of the universe, takes care of us.

As we read Ezekiel 34, notice how focused God is on our needs and how committed he is to our welfare. As you go through your days, remember that Christ the King is with you, taking care of you as a shepherd cares for his sheep.

Ezekiel 34:11–16, 23-24 (EHV)

¹¹For this is what the LORD God says. Here I am. I myself will seek the welfare of my flock and carefully search for them. ¹²As a shepherd searches for his flock when his sheep that were with him have been scattered, so I will search for my flock and rescue them from all the places where they were scattered on a day of clouds and thick darkness. ¹³I will bring them out from the peoples and gather them from the countries and bring them to their own soil. I will shepherd them on the mountains of Israel, in the valleys, and in all the settlements of the land. ¹⁴I will lead them into good pasture, and their grazing land will be on the high mountains of Israel. There they will lie down in good grazing land, and they will pasture on rich pasture on the mountains of Israel. ¹⁵I myself will shepherd my flock. I myself will let them lie down, declares the LORD God. ¹⁶I will seek the lost. I will bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured. I will strengthen the weak. I will destroy the fat and the strong, and I will shepherd them with justice.

²³Then I will raise up over them one shepherd, and he will tend them. My servant David will tend them, and he will be their shepherd. ²⁴I, the LORD, will be their God, and my servant David will be the prince among them. I, the LORD, have spoken.

Gospel Lesson

The King Goes to War

When you look at Jesus in the hands of the governor's soldiers, what do you see? Can you see the King of the Universe going to war to free sinners from the dungeons of hell? Or does it look more like a helpless, unfortunate man suffering abuse at the hands of evil men?

It's incredible that almighty God won the ultimate victory over all the forces of evil through submission, obedience, humiliation, and sacrifice. It was never about who was stronger. It was about paying a debt, about reconciling sinners, and about justice. To rescue us from condemnation and to free us from hell, our sin had to be atoned for. That would take much more than just smiting the devil. God's perfect justice had to be satisfied; our debt had to be paid.

Jesus paid it.

He was crushed for the guilt our sins deserved.

*The punishment that brought us peace was upon him,
and by his wounds we are healed. (Isaiah 53:5)*

When you look at Jesus abused and humiliated at the hands of evil men, we see our King paying our debt. We see our Savior satisfying the justice of our holy and perfect God. We see him healing the relationship we broke. We see him winning the war, defeating evil, conquering death, and opening the gates of heaven.

Jesus sacrifice is the most glorious act of selfless love in history. He gave up everything for those who gave him nothing but pain and scorn and rejection. He took our place; he suffered our punishment.

He saved us. Thank God. Really, thank him. Right now. Praise him. Glorify his holy name.

Matthew 27:27-31 (EHV)

²⁷ Then the governor's soldiers took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole cohort of soldiers around him. ²⁸ They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him. ²⁹ They twisted together a crown of thorns and put it on his head. They put a staff in his right hand, knelt in front of him, and mocked him by saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" ³⁰ They spit on him, took the staff, and hit him repeatedly on his head.

³¹ After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

Epistle Lesson/Sermon Text:

Long Live the King!

The story of Christ did not end on Good Friday. Jesus sacrificed everything to save us. He carried all of our sins to the cross and paid the ultimate price for our freedom. And he most surely died there. And he was buried.

And on the third day, he rose from the dead!

Christianity is not about sorrow and death. It's about joy and about life. It's about victory and freedom and forgiveness and peace. It's a lifelong celebration of Christ the King.

We celebrate together as we live in the knowledge that we will live forever with our loving Savior in the kingdom of God. Jesus defeated death and now he rules over everything for our good. 1 Corinthians 15:20–28 (EHV)

²⁰But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. ²¹For since death came by a man, the resurrection of the dead also is going to come by a man. ²²For as in Adam they all die, so also in Christ they all will be made alive. ²³But each in his own order: Christ as the firstfruits and then Christ's people, at his coming. ²⁴Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has done away with every other ruler and every other authority and power. ²⁵For he must reign "until he has put all his enemies under his feet." ²⁶Death is the last enemy to be done away with. ²⁷Certainly, "he has put all things in subjection under his feet." Now when it says that all things have been put in subjection, obviously that does not include the one who subjected all things to him. ²⁸But when all things have been subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to the one who subjected all things to him, in order that God may be all in all.
