Old Testament Lesson

Where Do You Find Relief?

God told Isaiah to comfort his people. Wouldn't be nice to get a little of that? There is always an overabundance of suffering and pain. Comfort seems to be in short supply.

The very first thing God told Isaiah to do was to speak to the heart of Jerusalem and tell her about forgiveness. Forgiveness is a powerful thing. Forgiveness from God is life-changing. It lifts an eternal weight off our conscience and breathes life into a weary soul. Never underestimate the power of forgiveness.

Then he told Isaiah to remind people not to put their hope in power or the plans of people. Human beings don't have the depth or the insight to solve problems older and deeper than we are. Look to God for salvation and solutions.

Finally, he tells us that God is here! He is with us in power. He is with us in love. He cares for us as our Good Shepherd. We are not alone. Our God is with us now and forever in love and forgiveness and welcome. What a comforting thought. What a comforting reality!

Isaiah 40:1-11 (EHV)

⁴⁰ Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

² Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call out to her.

Her warfare really is over.

Her guilt is fully paid for.

Yes, she has received from the LORD'S hand double for all her sins.

³ A voice is calling out:

In the wilderness prepare the way for the LORD.

In the wasteland make a level highway for our God.

⁴ Every valley will be raised up,

and every mountain and hill will be made low.

The rugged ground will become level,

and the rough places will become a plain.

⁵ Then the glory of the LORD will be revealed, and all flesh together will see it.

Yes, the mouth of the LORD has spoken.

⁶ A voice was saying, "Cry out!"

Epistle Lesson

Epic Patience

It's been 2000 years since Jesus said he was coming back. What's taking him so long? God is not slow; we are. God is patient. He gave the people of Noah's day 120 years. He's given us 2000!

God loves people so much that he waits for us. He waits for Christians to share the message. He waits for people to hear. He works in hearts that are unyielding and cold. He keeps working and he keeps waiting because he doesn't want anyone to die eternally in the fires of hell.

When Jesus comes again, he's coming in blazing glory and final judgment. Everything in creation will be destroyed. He wants to rescue as many people as possible before that happens. He will make a brand-new home for everyone who believes. He wants to bring home everybody appointed for salvation.

So, knowing that, what should we do? God has chosen us to bring the saving message of the Gospel to the world. He's done the hard part. We just have to let people know. Jesus is coming back. Let's bring as many people home as we can.

2 Peter 3:8-15a (EHV)

⁸ But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: For the Lord, one day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like one day. ⁹ The Lord is not slow to do what he promised, as some consider slowness. Instead, he is patient for your sakes, not wanting anyone to perish, but all to come to repentance.

¹⁰ But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. On that day the heavens will pass away with a roar, the elements will be dissolved as they burn with great heat, and the earth and what was done on it will be burned up. ¹¹ Therefore, since all these things will be destroyed, what kind of people ought you to be, living in holiness and godliness, ¹² as you look forward to and hasten the coming of the day of God? That day will cause the heavens to be set on fire and destroyed, and the elements to melt as they burn with great heat. ¹³ But according to his promise we look forward to new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells.

¹⁴ Therefore, dear friends, as you look forward to these things, make every effort to be found in peace, spotless and blameless in his sight. ¹⁵ Regard the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as also our dear brother Paul wrote to you, according to the wisdom that was given to him.

"Prepare the way of the Lord.

Make his paths straight."

⁴John appeared, baptizing in the wilderness and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins.

⁵The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him. They were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. ⁶John was clothed in camel's hair, and he wore a leather belt around his waist. He ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷He preached, "One more powerful than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of his sandals! ⁸I baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
