# The Story of Our Savior's Birth

In the beginning, God created a perfect world. It didn't take long for people to ruin it. It took even less time for God to provide a plan to rescue us from our sin. In Genesis 3:15, immediately after our fall into sin, God promised a Savior. He promised His own Son:

*I will put hostility between you and the woman,  
and between your seed and her seed.*

*He will crush your head,  
and you will crush his heel."*

As time passed, God gave more and more details about the coming Messiah. Through Moses, the Psalmist and Isaiah, He told us that Jesus would be from the tribe of Judah and among Jesse's and David's descendants. In Genesis 49:10 He writes:

*The scepter will not depart from Judah,  
nor the ruler's staff from between his feet,  
until the one to whom it belongs comes.*

*He will receive the obedience of the peoples.*

and in Psalm 132:11, He tells us:

The LORD swore to David,

*a truth which he will not turn back:*

*"From the fruit of your body*

*I will place kings on your throne.*

in Isaiah 11:1-2, The Lord continues:

*A shoot will spring up from the stump of Jesse,  
and a Branch from his roots will bear fruit.*

*The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him:  
the Spirit of wisdom and understanding,  
the Spirit of counsel and might,  
the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.*

Through Micah He told us very specifically where His Son would be born. Today we relive the fulfillment of these promises. Micah wrote for us in chapter 5:2:

*But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah,  
though you are small among the clans of Judah,  
from you, will go out the one who will be the ruler for me in Israel.  
His goings forth are from the beginning, from the days of eternity.*

1 O little town of Bethlehem,  
How still we see thee lie!  
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep  
the silent stars go by.  
Yet in thy dark streets shineth  
the ever lasting light.  
The hopes and fears of all the years  
are met in thee tonight.

2 For Christ is born of Mary,  
and gathered all above,  
While mortals sleep, the angels keep  
their watch of wondering love.  
O morning stars together  
proclaim the holy birth,  
And praises sing to God the King  
and peace to all the earth.

Caesar Augustus is one of the most well known of the Roman Emperors. His most famous act is one that might have surprised him. It was a simple decree for a census to determine the tax base for the empire.

Caesar thought that he was moving people to generate more money. In reality, God was moving history to fulfill prophecy. God used Caesar's decree to get Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem on Christmas day:

**Luke 2:1-7**

*Pastor & Barb*

*Mary Did You Know?*

And so God fulfilled some of the most beloved and well-known prophecies about His Son. Isaiah spoke in Isaiah 7:14 *Therefore the Lord himself will give a sign for all of you. Look! The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and name him Immanuel.*

Isaiah revealed that this baby, born in a manger, would bring light into the darkness and life into the land of the shadow of death. This was no ordinary child. This was the king, God himself, come into the world to save us. The prophet foretold in Isaiah 9:6:

*For to us a child is born.  
To us a son is given.  
The authority to rule will rest on his shoulders.  
He will be named:*

*Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.*
