1. Write all the Books of the Bible.

Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1st and 2nd Samuel, 1st and 2nd Kings, 1st and 2nd Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs (Song of Solomon), Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.

2. Write the Fourth Commandment.

Honor your father and mother, that it may go well with you
and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve and obey them, and give them love and respect.

3. *Passage* - Who are the representatives God has placed over us?

Ephesians 6:1–2 Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. Honor your father and mother”—which is the first commandment with a promise—

- a. Our parents.

Hebrews 13:7, 17 - Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith....Have confidence in your leaders and submit to their authority, because they keep watch over you as those who must give an account. Do this so that their work will be a joy, not a burden, for that would be of no benefit to you.

- b. The leaders of the church.

Romans 13:1 Everyone must submit to the governing authorities. For no authority exists except by God, and the authorities that do exist have been established by God.

- c. The leaders in our government.

4. What promise did God give in the Fourth Commandment?

Ephesians 6:2–3 2 “Honor your father and mother,” which is the first commandment with a promise: 3 “that it may go well with you and that you may live a long life on the earth.”

If we honor our parents, we will in joy long life on the earth.

5. In what ways do people break the Fourth Commandment?

Romans 13:2 2 Therefore the one who rebels against the authority is opposing God’s institution, and those who oppose will bring judgment on themselves..

- a. People rebel against authority.

Proverbs 30:11, 17 - There is a type of person who curses his father and does not bless his mother. An eye that mocks its father and despises the obedience due its mother— ravens of the valley will peck it out, and young vultures will eat it.

- b. People dishonor or make fun of their parents.

2 Timothy 3:2 For people will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, arrogant, blasphemous, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy,

- c. Children are disobedient to their parents.

6. *Passage* - What command did God give to parents about their children?

Proverbs 13:24 A person who withholds his rod hates his son, but one who loves him administers discipline promptly.

Proverbs 19:18 Discipline your son while there is hope. Do not make yourself responsible for his death.

God commands parents to discipline their children.

7. What should we do if someone in authority tells us to do something against God's will?

Acts 5:29 But Peter and the apostles replied, "We must obey God rather than men.

We have to obey God instead. We cannot obey a command that would break one of God's commands.

8. What things can we do to obey the Fourth Commandment?

Colossians 3:20 Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing in the Lord.

- a. Children can obey their parents.

1 Timothy 5:4 But if any widow has children or grandchildren, let them first learn to be devoted to their own household and repay their parents, for this is pleasing in the sight of God

- b. Take care of our family.

Ephesians 6:7 Serve with eagerness, as for the Lord and not for people,

- c. Work faithfully and diligently.

1 Thessalonians 5:12–13 Brothers, we ask you to take note of those who work hard among you, who exercise leadership over you in the Lord, and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love, on account of their work. Live at peace with each other.

- d. Honor our pastors, teachers, and church leaders.

Hebrews 13:17 Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls as men who will give an account. Obey them, so that they may do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no benefit to you.

- e. Submit to the authority of our church leaders.

Romans 13:7 Pay what you owe to all of them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, and honor to whom honor is owed.

- f. Pay our taxes.

Leviticus 19:32 You must rise in the presence of gray hair and show respect in the presence of an elder, so that you fear your God. I am the Lord.

- g. Show respect to the elderly.

9. *Eighth Grade* - Write the Second Article.

I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit; born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead.

What does this mean?

I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the Virgin Mary, is my Lord.
