1. Write the Books of the Bible from Habakkuk to 1st Corinthians.

Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi.
 Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts, Romans, 1st Corinthians.

2. Write the Fifth Commandment.

You shall not murder.
What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not hurt or harm our neighbor in his body, but help and befriend him in every bodily need.

3. Why is human life so precious?

Genesis 2:7 The LORD God formed the man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being.

Genesis 1:27 God created the man in his own image. In the image of God he created him. Male and female he created them.

- a. Human life is a unique and wonderful gift from God, who created our first parents in his own image. Only God can give life.

Isaiah 55:6 Seek the LORD while he may be found! Call on him while he is near!

- b. When Adam and Eve sinned, the image of God was lost. Our life on earth is our *time of grace*. It's our only chance to learn of God's grace and salvation.

4. Who alone has the right to end a person's life?

Psalms 31:15 My times are in your hand. Deliver me from the hand of my enemies and from those who pursue me.

- a. Only God can give life, so only God has the right to end it.

Romans 13:4 he is God's servant for your benefit. But if you do wrong, be afraid, because he does not carry the sword without reason. He is God's servant, a punisher to bring wrath on the wrongdoer..

- b. God delegates the right to end life to the government to protect the lives of others.

5. (Counts as two questions) Passage - What does God forbid in the Fifth Commandment?

Genesis 9:5-6 In fact, I will hold each animal and each person responsible for your lifeblood. I will hold each man responsible for the life of his brother. Whoever sheds man's blood, by man his blood shall be shed, for God made man in his own image.

- a. God forbids taking a human life.

Psalms 139:13 For you created my inner organs. You wove me together in my mother's womb.

- b. God forbids abortion.

Leviticus 19:16 You shall not go around spreading slander among your people. You shall not testify falsely against your neighbor in a capital case. I am the LORD.

- c. God forbids that we cause someone's death by deliberate carelessness.

Romans 12:19 Do not take revenge, dear friends, but leave room for God's wrath. For it is written, "Vengeance is mine; I will repay," says the Lord.

- d. God forbids revenge.

Proverbs 23:20 Do not be among those who drink too much wine, or those who eat too much meat,

Proverbs 23:31-33 Do not look at wine when it is red, when it sparkles in the cup, when it goes down smoothly.

Later it bites like a snake, and it strikes like a venomous viper. Your eyes will see strange things, and your mind will say senseless things.

- e. God forbids over eating and drinking too much or by abusing alcohol or drugs.

Psalm 31:15 My times are in your hand. Deliver me from the hand of my enemies and from those who pursue me.
f. God forbids suicide.

1 John 3:15 Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer, and you know that no murderer has eternal life remaining in him.

g. God forbids hatred and other cruel thoughts and words.

6. What does the Fifth Commandment require us to do?

Proverbs 31:8 Speak up for those who cannot speak. Speak for the rights of all those who are defenseless.

a. God commands us to defend people.

Ephesians 4:31–32 Get rid of every kind of bitterness, rage, anger, quarreling, and slander, along with every kind of malice. Instead, be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving one another, just as God in Christ has forgiven us.

Colossians 3:12–13 Therefore, as God's elect, holy and loved, clothe yourselves with heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. Bear with one another and forgive each other if anyone has a complaint against anyone else. Forgive, just as Christ forgave you

b. God commands us to forgive just as God forgave us.

Luke 10:30-37 - [The parable of the Good Samaritan]

c. God commands us to be a friend to people who need one.

7. Write one of the first four commandments.

The First Commandment.

You shall have no other gods.

What does this mean?

We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

The Second Commandment.

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not use His name to curse, swear, lie or deceive, or use witchcraft, but call upon God's name in every trouble, pray, praise and give thanks.

The Third Commandment.

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not despise preaching and His Word, but regard it as holy, and gladly hear and learn it.

The Fourth Commandment.

Honor your father and mother, that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth.

What does this mean?

We should fear and love God that we do not dishonor or anger our parents and others in authority, but honor, serve and obey them, and give them love and respect.
