Old Testament Lesson

It's always a miraculous, amazing event when God calls. When he called Samuel, he called him by name. Samuel misunderstood and ran to the wrong person. So, God called again – and again – and again. It's by pure grace that God keeps calling. So often, we, too, misunderstand our calling in life. We run to the wrong people, the wrong activities, and the wrong things. And God keeps calling.

Samuel's response is the response of faith. Speak, for your servant is listening. The most important part of following God is listening. We pray that God would lead us to listen, to learn, and to serve in faith. There is always the temptation to say instead, Listen Lord, for your servant is speaking. God shows his power in the gospel by creating in us a willingness to say: I don't know what is coming and what you will require of me; but whatever it is, I want to listen to you and to follow you!

Samuel's ministry was not easy. Ours won't be either. But God's Word calls us, guides us, and empowers us to follow him and to bring the light of life to people wherever we go.

1 Samuel 3:1-10 (EHV)

3 The boy Samuel was ministering to the LORD in the presence of Eli. The word of the LORD was rare in those days. Prophetic vision was not common.

² Now it happened that Eli's eyes had begun to grow dim, so that he could not see. Once when Eli was lying down in his place ³ and God's lamp had not yet gone out, Samuel was lying down in the LORD's temple, where God's ark was. ⁴ The LORD called Samuel, and Samuel said, "I am here." ⁵ He ran to Eli and said, "I am here, since you called me."

Eli said, "I did not call. Lie down again." So he went and lay down.

⁶ Then the LORD called once more, "Samuel!"

So Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, "I am here, since you called me."

He answered, "I did not call, my son. Lie down again."

⁷ Now Samuel had not yet experienced the LORD's presence, that is, the word of the LORD had not yet been revealed to him.

⁸ The LORD called Samuel for the third time. So he got up and went to Eli and said, "I am here, since you called me."

Then Eli realized that the LORD was calling the young man. ⁹ So Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down, and if he calls you, say, 'Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening.'"

So Samuel went and once again lay down in his place. ¹⁰ The LORD came and stood there and called as he had the other times, "Samuel! Samuel!"

Then Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

Epistle Lesson

Do we appreciate God's word? Do we comprehend just how much God does through his word? Do we realize that our life depends on it?

As we read Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, notice how integral God's Word is in his work. God chose us for salvation so the Spirit called us through his word. He keeps us in the faith by that same word. Then he encourages us and establishes our ministry through that same word.

Is it any wonder that right in the center of these words of praise, Paul tells them to hold on to those teachings? Whether we're speaking his word or reading it, God is at work in us. So, let's find ways to share the word: with each other, with family and friends, and with the world. God saved the Thessalonians through the word. He saved us through the word. He wants to save everyone with it.

Let's appreciate what we have and share it with the people God loves.

2 Thessalonians 2:13-17 (EHV)

¹³ But we are always obligated to thank God for you, brothers, loved by the Lord, because God chose you from the beginning for salvation by the sanctifying work of the Spirit and faith in the truth. ¹⁴ For this reason he also called you through our gospel so that you would obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. ¹⁵ So then, brothers, stand firm and hold on to the teachings that were passed along to you, either by word of mouth or by a letter from us. ¹⁶ May our Lord Jesus Christ himself and God our Father, who loved us and in his grace gave us eternal encouragement and good hope, ¹⁷ encourage your hearts and establish you in every good work and word.

Gospel Lesson/Sermon Text:

There is always a miraculous element in the call of Jesus. He calls us to follow him—but just think of where. He calls us to rejoice in the light of life—and to bring hope into the darkness. He calls us into hardship and sacrifice—and to the feast in heaven. It’s a miracle of the Holy Spirit that Philip recognized who Jesus was—and it was the power of God that changed Nathanael’s heart. Jesus saw Nathanael from a distance and then promised even more wondrous things; he promised that Nathanael with the eyes of faith would see heaven opened and Jesus as the ladder to heaven. Think the things God has revealed to us: the birth of our Savior, his death on the cross, his resurrection on Easter, and his ascension into heaven. He spreads the Gospel and saves souls. He called us and gave us his name. He will bring us through the trials of this life and into the glory of heaven.

John 1:43-51 (EHV)

⁴³ The next day, Jesus wanted to leave for Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, “Follow me.” ⁴⁴ Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the hometown of Andrew and Peter.

⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and told him, “We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote—Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.”

⁴⁶ Nathanael said to him, “Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?”

“Come and see!” Philip told him.

⁴⁷ Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him and said about him, “Truly, here is an Israelite in whom there is no deceit.”

⁴⁸ Nathanael asked him, “How do you know me?”

Jesus answered, “Before Philip called you, while you were under the fig tree, I saw you.”

⁴⁹ Nathanael answered him, “Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!”

⁵⁰ Jesus replied, “You believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree. You will see greater things than that!” ⁵¹ Then he added, “Amen, Amen, I tell you: You will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man.”
