Old Testament Lesson

What does God's voice sound like? It can be terrifying. That's why the Israelites begged Moses to speak to God for them. It can also be comforting beyond all measure—the voice of our Good Shepherd calling us back to safety when we wander and get lost. God's voice is the voice of final and irrevocable judgment. And his is the voice that will save your life.

There is no other voice like God's. That's what makes it even more amazing when God speaks through people like us. Moses spoke with God's voice, so did the prophets. Imagine what it would have been like to hear God's voice through Moses or Elijah.

Now imagine what it would have been like to hear the voice of Jesus Christ himself. God came to earth and spoke words of peace and life. No wonder God said, "Listen to him!"

Deuteronomy 18:15-20 (EHV)

¹⁵The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your brother Israelites. Listen to him.

¹⁶That is exactly what you asked from the LORD your God at Horeb on the day of the assembly. You said, “Do not let me hear the voice of the LORD my God anymore, and do not let me see this great fire again, or I will die.”

¹⁷Then the LORD said to me, “They have done well by saying what they said. ¹⁸I will raise up a prophet for them from among their brothers, like you, and I will put my words in his mouth, and he will speak to them everything that I command him. ¹⁹Anyone who will not listen to my words that the prophet speaks in my name, I myself will call him to account. ²⁰Any prophet who presumes to speak something in my name that I have not commanded him to speak or who speaks something in the name of other gods—that prophet shall die.”

Epistle Lesson

Most people vastly underestimate the glory and the power of Christ. Even Christians are tempted to look somewhere else for help and guidance. God tells us to focus our attention on Jesus. He is the only one who has ever been perfectly faithful. He is the one who builds the church. He is the one who opened the way. He is the one who redeems us, washes away our sin, and makes us part of God’s house. He watches over God’s house and keeps us safe until the end of time. Keep your attention focused on Jesus; he is our help and our salvation.

Hebrews 3:1-6 (EHV)

Therefore, holy brothers, who share in the heavenly calling, focus your attention on Jesus, the apostle and high priest whom we confess. ²He was faithful to the one who appointed him, as also Moses was faithful in God’s whole house. ³In fact, Jesus is worthy of greater glory than Moses, in the same way that the builder of a house has more honor than the house. ⁴For every house is built by someone, and God is the one who built everything.

⁵Moses was faithful as a servant within God’s whole house by testifying to the things that would be spoken. ⁶But Christ is faithful as a Son over God’s house. We are his house, if we hold on firmly to our confidence and the hope about which we boast until the end.

Gospel Lesson/Sermon Text:

When problems grow huge and unsolvable, what do you do? Where do you go?

In church, the expected answer is "Jesus." The remarkable thing is that "Jesus" is not only the correct answer; it is the only correct answer.

Jesus has the ultimate authority and power over everyone and everything. Even demons fear him. Jesus came to free people from the influence and domination of the devil. Our Gospel lesson puts Jesus' power on display. First, his teaching was with authority. Next, when a demon challenged him, Jesus silenced the spirit and cast him out, freeing the man who had been possessed. Everyone was amazed.

Jesus is still amazing. His word still has authority. He still frees people from the domination of the devil. Jesus is our freedom and our hope. No one else can do what Jesus does. Nothing else will suffice.

Mark 1:21-28 (EHV)

²¹ Then they went into Capernaum.

On the next Sabbath day, Jesus went into the synagogue and began to teach. ²² They were amazed at his teaching, because he was teaching them as

one who has authority and not as the experts in the law. ²³ Just then there was a man with an unclean spirit in their synagogue. It cried out, ²⁴ “What do we have to do with you, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are—the Holy One of God!”

²⁵ Jesus rebuked the spirit, saying, “Be quiet! Come out of him!”

²⁶ The unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions, and after crying out with a loud voice, it came out of him. ²⁷ Everyone was so amazed that they began to discuss this with each other. They said, “What is this? A new teaching with authority! He even commands the unclean spirits, and they obey him!” ²⁸ News about him spread quickly through all the region of Galilee.
