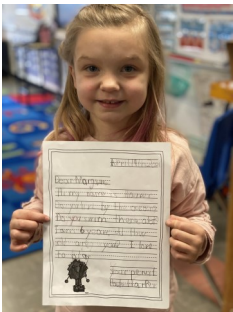

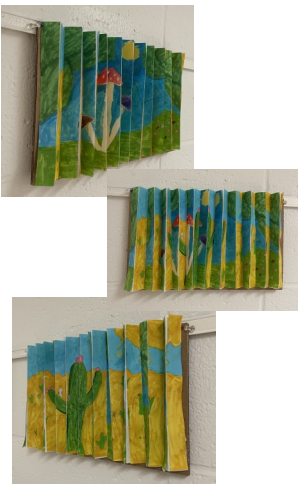
The fifth and sixth grade classes finished reading Paperboy by Vince Vawter. The underlying themes were overcoming stuttering, judging others, segregation, and what it means to be a dad. The seventh and eighth grades finished reading Fish in a Tree by Linda Mullaly Hunt. This book's themes incorporated the themes of overcoming dyslexia and bullying. For their final assignment on these books, they brought in items to represent various aspects of their novel. What fun it was to see their creativity and hear their explanations of how the items related to their story! The students are wrapping up the school year with summer-themed novels: One Crazy Summer by Rita Williams-Garcia and Summer of the Monkeys by Wilson Rawls.

English is somewhat of a review of punctuation, capitalization, conjunctions, and interjections. After these units, they will be diagramming sentences!

In art, students created two-way pictures. This means that when you look from the right, you see one image, and when you look from the left, you see a different image! While walking past the students' artwork hanging in the hallway, the images "change" as you pass by. (Pictured to the left is an example of one student's work - left-side view, center view, and right-side view). Another art project was telling stories through flip book art.

In science, the upper graders recently learned more about weather fronts and how weather moves. If you see a 5th-8th grade student, ask them this question: "What is wind?"
