We are looking forward to spending time on a research project during May!





5th - 8th Grades - Mr. Danell & Mrs. Kamps

In science, the upper graders recently learned more about weather fronts and how weather moves. If you see a 5th-8th grade student, ask them this question: "What is wind?"




