OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Another chance.

God gave Jonah another chance after he disobeyed God's command to preach to Nineveh. It took a miracle, but God brought Jonah to repentance and obedience.

Then, through Jonah's preaching, God gave Nineveh a chance, a chance to repent. It took a miracle, but the people of Nineveh repented and turned from their evil ways.

Now, God gives us and the people we know a chance. To this day, God creates faith and brings people to repentance. It takes a miracle, but God still works miracles through his Word, turning our hearts away from sin to repentance, forgiveness and life.

Jonah 3:1-10 (EHV)

¹Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time:

²“Get up, go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you.”

³So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh just as the word of the LORD had commanded. Now Nineveh was a great city to God. It required a three-day walk. ⁴Jonah walked through the city for a day, and he called out, “Forty more days and Nineveh is going to be overthrown!”

⁵The men of Nineveh believed God. They proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least. ⁶When word reached the king of Nineveh, he got up from his throne, took off his royal robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. ⁷Then he issued a proclamation in Nineveh.

By the decree of the king and his leading officials:

Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything. Do not let them eat food or drink water.

⁸Instead let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call fervently to God. Let them turn from their evil way and from the violence that is in their hands. ⁹Who knows? God may turn and relent. He may turn from his burning anger so that we will not perish.

¹⁰When God saw their actions, that they had turned from their evil way, God relented from the disaster which he said he would bring on them, and he did not carry it out.

EPISTLE LESSON

You hear things about people. Sometimes it makes you shake your head and wonder. Sometimes it can make you cry. It's a sinful world filled with sinful people and there's no shortage of stupidity and even just plain evil.

But, every once in a while, you hear something wonderful, something that fills your heart and lifts your spirit. In the middle of this sinful world, we are not alone. God is here. God is working to change hearts, save souls and transform lives. When God rescues a life there is joy in the presence of the angels of God. And, every once in a while, we get to hear about it.

When we do, we cannot help but thank God for his grace.

When the apostle Paul and his coworkers heard about the faith of the Christians in Colossae, they thanked God because of what they heard.

What did they hear? They heard about faith showing itself – showing itself in love – love for God and love for people.

Faith shows itself when we love each other – when we spend time with each other, help each other, visit each other, pray for each other, and encourage each other. It shows itself when we are excited to worship the Lord our God. It shows itself when we serve together to glorify his holy name.

Thank God for bringing love into this world. Thank God for bringing faith to lost hearts. Thank God that we are not alone.

Colossians 1:3–8 (EHV)

³We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, ⁴because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and the love that you have for all the saints ⁵because of the hope that is stored up for you in heaven. You have already heard about this in the word of truth, the gospel ⁶that is present with you now. The gospel is bearing fruit and growing in the entire world, just as it also has been doing among you from the day you heard it and came to know the grace of God in truth. ⁷You learned this from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf. ⁸He is the one who told us about your love in the Spirit.

SERMON ~ GOSPEL LESSON

Plants are amazing. They are beautiful, life-giving, oxygen-providing, works of God. They take dirt, sunshine, carbon dioxide and water and turn it into food and oxygen. That's amazing! Plants start from tiny seeds, from mustard seeds, celery seeds, acorns, and spores, and grow into plants much larger than the original seed. They provide shelter, nesting space, and a home for everything around them. Miraculous!

Jesus says that the kingdom of God is like that. He says we're like that. God gives us faith and he makes it grow. As we grow, we bring blessing to everyone around us. Within us, we have the power of God. Through our work, we exhale the ether of life, the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The kingdom of God provides shelter from the storms of sin and a safe place for our families against the menace of Satan.

How faith is created and how it grows is a mystery to us. We know that God uses Word and Sacrament. We experience how faith grows. But we don't know how he does it. It's like plants growing. God is at work. From its smallest beginnings, faith is powerful and life-changing. God is creating life where there was none and a kingdom where we can find shelter, family, and a home.

Every time you see a plant growing, think about the miraculous, living faith that God has planted in you.

Mark 4:26–34 (EHV)

²⁶He said, “The kingdom of God is like this: A man scatters seed on the ground, ²⁷and while he sleeps and rises, night and day, the seed sprouts and grows, though he does not know how. ²⁸The ground produces fruit on its own: first the blade, then the head, then the full grain in the head. ²⁹When the crop is ready, he swings the sickle without delay, because the harvest has come.”

³⁰Then he said, “To what should we compare the kingdom of God? Or with what parable may we picture it? ³¹It is like a mustard seed, which when sown on the ground is one of the smallest of all the seeds planted in the ground. ³²Yet when it is planted, it grows up and becomes larger than all the garden plants and puts out large branches so that the birds of the sky can nest under its shade.”

³³With many similar parables he continued to speak the word to them, as much as they were able to hear. ³⁴He did not speak to them without a parable. But when he was alone with his disciples, he explained everything to them.
