THE WORD

EPISTLE LESSON

The Bible is filled with God's divine wisdom, knowledge and love. Some teachings are simple. Some are deep and complex. The more we study the Bible, the more our faith and knowledge grow. There are teachings that are simple enough for small children to believe like "Jesus loves me." There are others that are deeper and harder to comprehend like "Jesus loves me." Still others are beyond human comprehension like God's election from eternity and divine grace and justice.

It's not that there are important teachings and unimportant ones. It's that some teachings require maturity to learn and to put into practice. They have to be built on previous teachings. For example, we start by learning that we are saved. Then we move on to the teaching that because

we have been saved by God through his grace that we should eagerly desire to grow more and more in love to him.

That love in turn finds expression in a new attitude toward life and a new desire to fight the temptations of worldliness and materialism. The new attitude gives rise to a new eagerness to live in service to one another in gratitude to him who gave the precious milk of the gospel.

There is much to learn and a great opportunity to grow.

Hebrews 5:11—6:3 (EHV)

¹¹ We have much to say about this, and it is difficult to explain, because you have become too lazy to listen. ¹² In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the beginning principles of God's word all over again. You have become people who need milk, not solid food. ¹³ For everyone who lives on milk is not acquainted with the word of righteousness, because he is still an infant. ¹⁴ But solid food is for mature people, who have their senses trained by practice to distinguish between good and evil.

^{6:1} Therefore, leaving the beginning discussion of Christ, let us press on toward matters that require greater maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, of faith in God, ² of the teaching about baptisms, of the laying on of hands, of the resurrection of the dead, and of eternal judgment. ³ And we will do this, if God permits.

GOSPEL LESSON

People like it when Jesus tells them what they like to hear. They get upset when he starts talking like God. The divine is beyond our understanding and it makes us uncomfortable.

The people of Jesus' time want a king who would give them stuff. They didn't want to hear about how Jesus came down from heaven. That was confusing, unsettling, and uncomfortable. They wanted obvious. They wanted simple. They didn't want God.

They rejected the ultimate bread from heaven whose person, whose coming, whose dying, whose rising again is the only source of eternal life.

Jesus is the bread of life. We come to him to be taught, to learn, and to grow; not just to hear what we want to hear. We come to be filled with our Savior.

John 6:41-51 (EHV)

⁴¹ So the Jews started grumbling about him, because he said, "I am the bread that came down from heaven." ⁴² They asked, "Isn't this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? So how can he say, 'I have come down from heaven'?"

⁴³ Jesus answered them, "Stop grumbling among yourselves. ⁴⁴ No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draws him. And I will raise him up on the Last Day. ⁴⁵ It is written in the Prophets, 'They will all be taught by God.' Everyone who listens to the Father and learns from him comes to me. ⁴⁶ I am not saying that anyone has seen the Father except the one who is from God. He is the one who has seen the Father. ⁴⁷ Amen, Amen, I tell you: The one who believes in me has eternal life.

⁴⁸ "I am the Bread of Life. ⁴⁹ Your fathers ate manna in the wilderness, and they died. ⁵⁰ This is the bread that comes down from heaven, so that anyone may eat it and not die. ⁵¹ I am the living bread which came down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread, he will live forever. The bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

SERMON

Our Old Testament lesson teaches us that miracles have only a limited and temporary effect on those who see them. Even Elijah soon forgot the proof of God's presence demonstrated on the fire of God falling on the sacrifice on Mount Carmel. He fell into fear and despair. What could restore his confidence? Only the Word! God provided a meal that sustained Elijah for 40 days, but Elijah was still despondent. Three more miracles did not restore him; the Lord was not in the miracles. God is only found in his Word. God's Word strengthened, equipped and inspired Elijah.

God's Word is still the only place we can go for spiritual strength and reliable truth.

1st Kings 19:3-18 (EHV)

³ Elijah was afraid, and he ran for his life. He went to Beersheba, which belongs to Judah, and he left his servant there. ⁴ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness. There he sat down under a broom tree, where he prayed that he would die. He said, "I've had enough, LORD. Take my life, for I am no better than my fathers." ⁵ Then he lay down and went to sleep under the broom tree.

Suddenly an angel touched him and said, "Get up and eat."

⁶Then he looked around, and near his head there was a loaf of bread baking on coals and a jar of water, so he ate and drank, and then he lay down again.

⁷ Then the angel of the LORD came back a second time and touched him and said, "Get up and eat, because the journey is too much for you."

⁸ So he got up and ate and drank. Then, with the strength gained from that food, he walked for forty days and forty nights to Horeb, the mountain of God. ⁹ He came to a cave and spent the night there.

Then the word of the LORD suddenly came to him, saying, "Why are you here, Elijah?"

¹⁰ He said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of Armies, but the people of Israel have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking to take my life."

¹¹ Then the LORD said, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the LORD, for the LORD is passing by." Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains and shattered rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind.

After the wind came an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake.

¹² After the earthquake there was a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire.

After the fire there was a soft, whispering voice.

¹³ When Elijah heard it, he wrapped his face in his cloak, and he went out and stood at the entrance to the cave. Then a voice came to him and said, "Why are you here, Elijah?"

¹⁴ He said, "I have been very zealous for the LORD, the God of Armies, but the people of Israel have abandoned your covenant. They have torn down your altars and killed your prophets with the sword. I alone am left, and they are seeking to take my life."

¹⁵ Then the LORD said to him, "Go back the way you came and go to the Wilderness of Damascus. When you get there, you are to anoint Hazael as king over Aram. ¹⁶ You will also anoint Jehu son of Nimshi as

king over Israel and Elisha son of Shaphat from Abel Meholah as prophet in your place. ¹⁷ Whoever escapes the sword of Hazael, Jehu will kill, and whoever escapes the sword of Jehu, Elisha will kill. ¹⁸ But I have preserved in Israel seven thousand whose knees have not bent to Baal and whose lips have not kissed him."
