Historical Lesson

Our Historical lesson shows God's power at work through his people. God's people have a lot to offer. However, we offer people what everyone really needs, not necessarily what they want.

We don't offer people what they think they need, like money or success or possessions. We offer people the power of God. We offer people forgiveness and peace in Jesus Christ. Only God can make people healthy. Only Jesus can set people free from sin. Jesus washes us clean and brings us into God's family. He changes our lives forever.

So, we praise him for his goodness – in good times and in bad. We get excited about what he does in our lives and in the lives of others. God saved the lame man—not just from a physical impediment, but from sin and Satan and eternal death!

Acts 3:1~10 (EHV)

¹Peter and John were going up to the temple at the ninth hour, an hour of prayer. ²A certain man who was lame from birth was carried there every day and placed at the temple gate, which is called Beautiful, so that he could beg for donations from those entering the temple. ³When he saw Peter and John about to enter the temple, he asked them for a donation.

⁴Peter looked directly at him, as did John. Peter said, "Look at us." ⁵So the man paid close attention to them, expecting to receive something from them.

⁶But Peter said, "Silver and gold I do not have, but what I have I will give you. In the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, get up and walk!" ⁷Peter took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately the man's feet and ankles were made strong. ⁸Jumping up, he stood and began to walk. He entered the temple courts with them, walking, jumping, and praising God.

⁹All the people saw him walking and praising God. ¹⁰They recognized him as the one who used to sit begging for money at the Beautiful Gate of the temple, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

Gospel Lesson

Maybe the man was frightened and confused about what the crowd was doing with him. Maybe it was something else, but, Jesus dealt with this man gently, showing understanding and compassion.

That is exactly how he deals with us: one at a time, with perfect perception and infinite love.

³¹Jesus left the region of Tyre again and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, within the region of the Decapolis.

³²They brought a man to him who was deaf and had a speech impediment. They pleaded with Jesus to place his hand on him. ³³Jesus took him aside in private, away from the crowd. He put his fingers into the man's ears. Then he spit and touched the man's tongue. ³⁴After he looked up to heaven, he sighed and said, "*Ephphatha!*" (which means "Be opened!") ³⁵Immediately the man's ears were opened, his tongue was set free, and he began to speak plainly. ³⁶Jesus gave the people strict orders to tell no one, but the more he did so, the more they kept proclaiming it. ³⁷They were amazed beyond measure and said, "He has done everything well. He even makes the deaf hear and the mute speak!"
