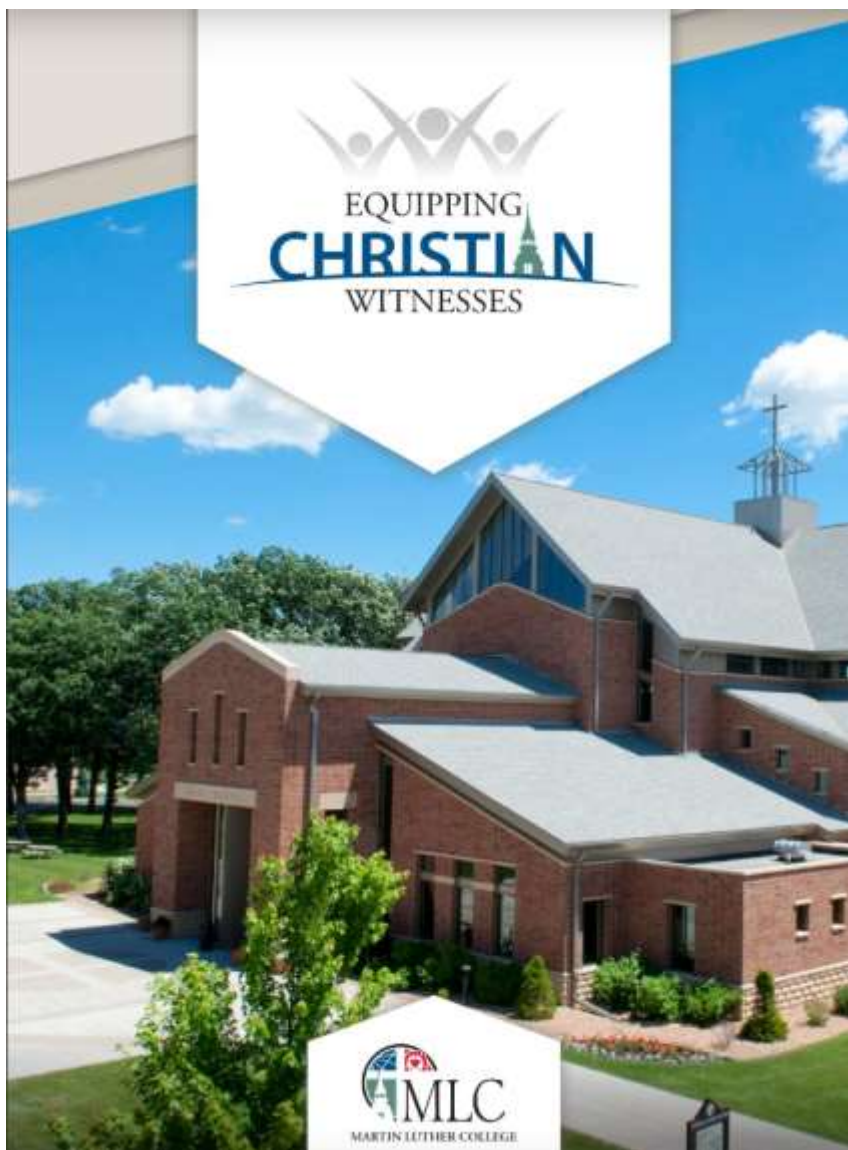

P: Let us pray.

Lord God, you call us to work in your kingdom and leave no one standing idle. Help us to order our lives by your wisdom and to serve you in willing obedience; through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Old Testament Lesson

God's people have always suffered for speaking the truth. God's word is rarely popular and often resisted. God's law reveals sin so it makes people uncomfortable. It is far easier to attack the messenger than to swallow your pride and repent.

Ironically, the very word that people reject is the word that brings life. We share the word to help people, to bring them to their Savior and to free them from sin and death. When Jeremiah spoke God's word, his people were under imminent judgment. Jerusalem was already surrounded by the armies of Babylon and the end was growing near. Jeremiah brought his people their only hope. God told them to repent and to submit—then they would live.

That wasn't the message people wanted to hear. They didn't want to hear about their sin. So, instead of listening to God, they persecuted his prophet. Jeremiah was persecuted by people who should have known better, people he cared about. People he wanted to save.

We, too, can suffer teaching the truth. Jesus told us to take up our cross and follow him. Part of that cross is enduring the rejection and scorn of people who don't want to be bothered with the truth of God. Like Jeremiah, we keep speaking the truth in love, even when we are rejected for it.

Jeremiah 38:1-13 (EHV)

¹Shephatiah son of Mattah, Gedaliah son of Pashhur, Jehucal son of Shelemiah, and Pashhur son of Malkijah heard what Jeremiah had told the people when he said, ²“This is what the Lord says. Whoever remains in this city will die by sword, famine, and plague, but whoever goes over to the Chaldeans will live. He will escape with his life, and he will live. ³This is what the Lord says. This city will surely be handed over to the army of the king of Babylon, and he will capture it.”

⁴Then the officials said to the king, “This man should be put to death because he is demoralizing the soldiers who are left in the city. He is demoralizing all the people by saying these things to them. This man is not seeking the welfare of the people. He wants to hurt them.”

⁵King Zedekiah answered, “Very well. He is in your hands. The king cannot do anything to stop you.”

⁶So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the cistern of Malkijah, the king’s son, which was in the courtyard of the guard. They let Jeremiah down by ropes. There was no water in the cistern, but only mud, and Jeremiah sank down into the mud.

⁷Ebed Melek the Cushite, an official in the king’s house, heard that they had put Jeremiah in the cistern. While the king was sitting in the Benjamin Gate, ⁸Ebed Melek left the palace and said to the king, ⁹“My lord the king, everything that these men have done to Jeremiah the prophet is evil. They have thrown him into a cistern, where he is likely to die because of the famine, for there is no more bread in the city.”

¹⁰Then the king gave orders to Ebed Melek the Cushite: “Take thirty men from here under your command and lift Jeremiah the prophet up out of the cistern before he dies.”

¹¹So Ebed Melek took command of the men and entered a room under the treasury in the palace. He took some old rags and worn-out clothing from there, and he lowered them with ropes to Jeremiah in the cistern. ¹²Ebed Melek the Cushite said to Jeremiah, “Put these rags and worn-out clothes under your arms to pad the ropes.” After Jeremiah did that, ¹³they lifted him up with the ropes and pulled him out of the cistern. After this Jeremiah remained in the courtyard of the guard.

Epistle Lesson

In our Epistle lesson God tells us to rejoice when we suffer because it means that we're sharing in the sufferings of Christ. We're making a difference in the spiritual battle. He tells us that the name of God will always attract persecution, but that that same name is the only hope that people have for salvation.

We aren't ashamed when we are insulted for Christ; it's actually a compliment! We are ashamed when we suffer for our sin, but never for being a Christian. We commit ourselves to God and continue to do good.

1 Peter 4:12–19

¹²Dear friends, do not be surprised by the fiery trial that is happening among you to test you, as if something strange were happening to you.

¹³Instead rejoice whenever you are sharing in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed.

¹⁴If you are insulted in connection with the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. ¹⁵Make sure that none of you suffers as a murderer, a thief, a criminal, or as a meddler.

¹⁶But if you suffer for being a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God in connection with this name. ¹⁷For the time has come for judgment to begin with the household of God. Now if it begins with us, what will be the end for those who disobey the gospel of God? ¹⁸And if it is hard for the righteous to be saved, where will the ungodly sinner end up? ¹⁹So let those who suffer according to the will of God entrust their souls to their faithful Creator while doing what is good.

Verse of the Day

Alleluia. Everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. Alleluia.

Gospel Lesson

Jesus didn't come to be popular or serve himself. He came to suffer—he came to die. He came to live in perfect obedience to his Father and in perfect love for us. He came to submit to his Father's will and to sacrifice everything for us and for our salvation.

His obedience and love were not easy or cheap. Ours shouldn't be either. We are not saved so we can sin more. We are saved to live for Jesus, to bear our cross. The cross is always painful. Our cross is anything that we suffer in consequence of our faith. The world rejected Jesus; it will reject us too. We choose to live our faith. It's not always easy or convenient, but it's the only thing a living faith can do.

Mark 8:27-35 (EHV)

²⁷Jesus went away with his disciples to the villages of Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked his disciples, “Who do people say that I am?”

²⁸They told him, “John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others say one of the prophets.”

²⁹“But who do you say I am?” he asked them.

Peter answered him, “You are the Christ.”

³⁰Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him.

³¹Jesus began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things; be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the experts in the law; be killed; and after three days rise again. ³²He was speaking plainly to them. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

³³But after turning around and looking at his disciples, Jesus rebuked Peter and said, “Get behind me, Satan! You do not have your mind set on the things of God, but the things of men.”

³⁴He called the crowd and his disciples together and said to them, “If anyone wants to follow me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. ³⁵For whoever wants to save his life will lose it. But whoever loses his life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.
