Lighting of the Advent Candles

- M: We light one Advent candle, remembering Jesus who is coming again. He will come to gather his people from everywhere, both the living and the dead.
- C: We remember Jesus who will come at the end of time. None of us knows what day that will be.
- M: We hear his call to watch.
- C: We light one Advent candle as a sign of our watchfulness and waiting.

Hymn Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel CW 23 v.1

The First Advent candle is lit.

M: We light two Advent candles remembering Jesus who came in history. He came into a world of sin and death.

C: We remember Jesus who came as the promised Messiah. John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord.

M: We hear his call to repent.

C: We light two Advent candles as a sign of our repentance and desire for renewal.

Hymn Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel CW 23 v.2

The Second Advent candle is lit.

M: We light three Advent candles remembering Jesus, the light of the world. He came to cast out the prince of darkness.

C: We remember Jesus who came in answer to his people's prayers. John proclaimed him the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

M: We hear his call to see the light.

C: We light three Advent candles as a sign of our trust and confidence.

Hymn Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel *CW* 23 v.3

The Third Advent candle is lit.

M: We light four Advent candles remembering Jesus, the Son of God and Son of Mary. He came to share our humanity.

C: We remember Jesus whose name means Savior. He came to save his people from their sins.

M: We hear his call to give him a place in our hearts.

C: We light four Advent candles as a sign of our joy and hope.

Hymn Oh, Come, Oh, Come, Emmanuel CW 23 v.4

The Fourth Advent candle is lit.

Lighting the Christ Candle

M: We light the Christ candle to remind us that the light of the world was born this night.

C: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light.

Those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness - on them a light has shined.

M: You, O Lord, have enlarged the nation and have increased their joy.

C: For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government shall be upon his shoulders.

The Christ Candle is lit.

M: And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

C: He is also called Emmanuel, for in him God is with us.

M: Let us Pray

C: Most Loving Father, thank you for this night and for all it represents. Thank you for the hope you bestow, the peace you bring, the love you pour out, and the joy you give. We praise you most of all for Jesus, your Word made flesh. May he light our way as the holy star lit the way for the wise men. Amen.
