The Confession and Absolution

Pastor: Let us confess our sins with the words of the penitential psalm of David:

People: Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions.

Wash away all my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.

Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight so that you are proved right when you speak and justified when you judge.

Surely I have been a sinner from birth, sinful from the time my mother conceived me.

Cleanse me with hyssop, and I will be clean; wash me and I will be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones you have crushed rejoice.

Luke 2:1-7

2 And it came to pass in those days, that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus, that all the world should be taxed. ² (*And* this taxing was first made when Cyrenius was governor of Syria.) ³ And all went to be taxed, every one into his own city. ⁴ And Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judaea, unto the city of David, which is called Bethlehem; (because he was of the house and lineage of David:) ⁵ To be taxed with Mary his espoused wife, being great with child. ⁶ And so it was, that, while they were there, the days were accomplished that she should be delivered. ⁷ And she brought forth her firstborn son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.

Responsive Prayer

Pastor: Gracious God, at this Christmastide we hail once again the coming of Jesus, our Lord.

People: "He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God ..." (John 1:11-12).

Pastor: We are thankful, Almighty One, to be numbered among your children. We pray that our church's festive appearance and our tribute of worship may please you.

People: "Go and learn what this means, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' For I have come to call not the righteous but sinners" (Matthew 9:13).

Pastor: The world is rife with sin and with death, the wages of sin. We implore you, Prince of Peace, to bring your peace of forgiveness and reconciliation to all people on the earth.

People: "[Jesus] came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father" (Ephesians 2:17-18).

Pastor: But how can we make peace in the midst of war, Lord, when the enemy is committed to destroying us?

People: "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28).

Pastor: O God, we need courage to question our own wisdom and understanding, to explore Your Word, to live by faith, and to speak truth to the powers of this world.

People: "For this I was born, and for this I came into the world to testify to the truth" (John 18:37).

Pastor: But can we expect people to listen to the truth?

People: "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37b). "The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners..." (1 Timothy 1:15).

Pastor: So let the celebration begin. The Lord is at hand!

People: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor" (Isaiah 61:1-2, quoted in Luke 4:18-19).

Pastor: O Lord, help us to have no anxiety about anything, but remember with deep thanksgiving your gracious words:

People: "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly" (John 10:10).

Pastor: "Come, thou long-expected Jesus, born to set thy people free. From our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in thee."

People: "Born thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a King. Born to reign in us forever, now thy gracious kingdom bring!" Amen.
