As always, October was a busy month in grades 2-4. We can hardly believe the month is almost over! This month, our class was most excited about beginning our study of science. We have been focused on exploring how water shapes the earth's surface. During the past few days, we've been able to spend a little extra time outside, enjoying the beautiful and warm fall weather.

5th, 6th, 7th, & 8th

The new quarter brings about new novel units: the classic Caddie Woodlawn (based on the Wisconsin pioneer life of author Carol Ryrie Brink's grandmother in 1864) and A Day No Pigs Would Die (a coming-of-age story based on author Robert Newton Peck's Vermont farm life in 1932). Upper graders are also learning about what life was like in Europe during medieval times in a feudal society. We are also recognizing how the system of feudalism declined and gave rise to more of a democratic thought.
